

A WORD FROM YOUR CLERK

Maybe it's Spring Fever, but there's a lot of excitement around the church these days! You may not realize it, but the Facilities Committee is responsible for many upgrades and new projects around HMPC. John Keck Moore and Chauncey Leggett are the "Go To" folks on the Session as Co-chairs of the committee. Chauncey started one of his reports at a Session Meeting by saying, "We break stuff and we fix stuff." The Facilities Committee does way more than that!


Just in the last few months, here's what's happened:

- Carpet pulled up and new floors installed in the offices, with new rugs (minister's office painted)
- Carpets cleaned and spot cleaned in several downstairs rooms and the sanctuary
- Ongoing door replacement project in Burns Hall and the small hallway entrance
- Internet upgrades in the sanctuary and CE Building down to and including Burns Hall faster, more secure wi-fi, better video quality
- Two new street lights in place in the playground and the back of the Memorial Garden
- PVC fence screening trash cans beside the kitchen
- Removeable rails for pulpit steps project in progress
- New LED lighting installed in sanctuary ceiling beside choir loft (both sides – with a TALL ladder) and sconce light bulbs replaced

And all this is in addition to the regular "Break it and Fix it" things.

One project that we're very excited about is the installation of the Cordle Carillon. Last week, the Verdin Company sent representatives to connect the speakers, which are hidden away in the steeple, to a digital control panel in the "audio room" in the back of the sanctuary. Skilled electricians got the wiring ready – crawling through a tiny hole in the ceiling and up into the steeple. Chauncey, John Keck and Steve Brittain were there to try out the carillon and I was lucky enough to hear it chiming a hymn and a bagpipe serenade. It was AMAZING! There is a catalog with a wide range of songs and chimes that we can use. The Worship Committee will meet to set guidelines for using the carillon — when it rings and sings — and all of this will be approved by the Session. But one thing we do know, it will officially





play for the first time on Sunday, May 5 when the Cordle Carillon is dedicated to the memory of Carol and Tom. Their daughters and family will be in attendance for the special service commemorating the 1909 dedication of the Howard Memorial Presbyterian Church brick sanctuary. What a fitting tribute to Carol and Tom's service to the Lord, our church and our community. The chimes of the carillon will bring all three together.

Mark your calendars for Sunday, May 5. It will be a special day in the life of HMPC. Cindy Brittain, Clerk of Session, HMPC

PS — The carillon doesn't interfere with our bell! It can still be rung the same way. In fact, the Verdin Rep. told us it was an amazing bell — not made of steel like most post-Civil War bells.


The day promises to be a time of enjoyment, renewal and it's all for a good cause!


